

AUSTRALIA-SINGAPORE CO-PRODUCTION AGREEMENT

The Australia-Singapore Co-Production Agreement was signed by Singapore's Minister for Foreign Affairs, George Yeo and former Australian Minister for the Arts and Sport, Sen George Brandis, on the sidelines of the APEC meetings on Friday, 7 September 2007 at the Park Hyatt Hotel in Sydney. This Agreement entered into force on 16 October 2008 following the diplomatic exchange of notes between the Singapore and Australia governments.

Under this Agreement, a film or television program approved as an Official Australia-Singapore Co-Production will be considered as a national production in each of the co-production countries. Producers can also apply for any benefits or programs of assistance available in their country. The Australia-Singapore Co-Production Agreement is administered by MDA's International Relations team, together with Screen Australia (www.screenaustralia.gov.au).
