

NEW ZEALAND-SINGAPORE CO-PRODUCTION AGREEMENT

The New Zealand-Singapore Films Co-Production Agreement was signed on the sidelines of the second Ministerial review of the Agreement between New Zealand and Singapore on a Closer Economic Partnership (ANZSCEP) on 13 July 2004. Singapore is the first Asian country to sign such a co-production agreement with New Zealand, paving the way for creative minds in both countries to collaborate on film, TV, animation and other media projects.

Under this Agreement, a film or television program approved as an Official New Zealand-Singapore Official Co-Production will be considered as a national production in each of the co-production countries. Producers can also apply for any benefits or programs of assistance available in their country. This Agreement is administered by MDA's International Relations team, together with the New Zealand Film Commission (www.nzfilm.co.nz).
